To apply for the event, send an abstract (max. 750 words) of your working paper to wieland@cbs.dk by **April 9**. Kindly note that acceptance of the abstract is a prerequisite for registration. The workshop is restricted to a maximum of 20 participants. The registration fee for this event is DKK1000 (ca. €135) and includes coffee, lunch, and a joint dinner on Thursday.

After registration and prior to the event, participants are expected to share their working papers (max. 10,000 words) with their peers (two weeks before the event latest) and prepare written feedback on three other papers. After the workshop, the most promising papers of the participants will be invited for submission to *JSCM*.

Upon completion of the workshop, attendees will have the opportunity to obtain a certificate of attendance.

We understand that some participants may have travel restrictions (e.g., visa), and we are happy to provide a remote option as a backup solution. However, please keep in mind that attending in person allows for greater interaction and collaboration with other participants.

We are committed to minimizing the carbon footprint of this workshop. We strongly urge you to consider alternative modes of transportation instead of flying, as air travel is a significant contributor to greenhouse gas emissions. Copenhagen is easily accessible via train and bus connections from both Hamburg and Stockholm. Together, we can work towards a more sustainable future by reducing our impact on the environment.
